
In June 2023, 22,197 individuals representing 7,658 households (HHs) were recorded in seven reception centres in Borno state, with women and children accounting for 89% of the total. Consistent with previous reports, the displaced population in reception centre has been decreased by 6% compared with last month. Total 1,195 HHs departure to the camp shelter (85%) and host community (15%). In the seven reception centres across Bama, Dikwa, Gwoza, Monguno,


and Ngala LGAs, 1,172 HHs (3,176 individuals) of new arrivals were registered, representing a 9% decrease from the previous month. 5,751 HHs have stayed for over three months against recommended 72 hours for referrals in Pulka (2,700), Ngala (1,682), Monguno (673), Bama (317), Banki (254) and Dikwa 125 reception centres. There is an immediate need for CCCM, shelter, NFI, WASH, food, protection and health care services across the reception centres.

HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE AND GAPS

SHELTER

ACTIVE SERVICES

Shelter services include shelter construction, reinforcement, shelter kit distribution and shelter repair.

GAPS 4,521 HHs (total overstretch population) urgently need shelter responses in the seven reception centres. During this period, a total of 595 HHs were recorded living outside, while 545 HHs were referred for sharing modalities. In Gwoza and Monguno, there is an urgent need to construct 1.478 shelters for 1.478 HHs without shelters

NFI NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFI)

ACTIVE SERVICES

NFI services include the distribution of NFI kits (Standard/Improved).

GAPS

4,135 HHs, including new arrivals households, urgently need NFI items, particularly blankets, kitchen sets, mats, buckets/jerrycans, soap and mosquito nets. There is a need for NFI intervention at the point of arrival in Bama, Monguno and Ngala.

Tim CAMP COORD. AND CAMP MANAGEMENT

ACTIVE SERVICES

includes registration, sensitization, sanitation, shelter allocation, CCCM services service/intervention advocacy, coordination meetings, referrals and complaints and feedback mechanism

GAPS

The CCCM partners in Bama, Ngala, Pulka, Banki, and Monguno have raised concerns about congestion and a need for responses in these locations.



FOOD SECURITY (FS)

ACTIVE SERVICES

Food security services include wet feeding, general food distribution and cash based transfer.

1,499 HHs received in-kind food distribution across the five reception centres during this period.





NUTRITION

ACTIVE SERVICES

Supplementary feeding for children, malnourished children, pregnant and lactating mothers, and Screening for malnourished children.

GAPS

51 malnutrition cases reported in Bama (49) and Ngala(2). There is a need for more supplementary feeding for children, pregnant and lactating mother in Monguno, Ngala and Pulka reception centres.

THEALTH **ACTIVE SERVICES**

Medical screening, referrals, vaccination, immunization, distribution of essential medicine in all RCs.

Monguno and Ngala reception centres lack functional primary health care. Secondary health care is required in Banki, Dikwa, Pulka, Gwoza, Monguno, and Ngala.

PROTECTION PROTECTION **ACTIVE SERVICES**

Protection services include Legal Documentation, Gender Based Violence (GBV) services, general protection services, referrals, vulnerability screening, child protection services and mental health and pschosocial support (MHPSS) services.

CCCM partners noted the need for legal aid on protection concerns in Ngala, Pulka, and Dikwa. There is MHPSS services in In Ngala and Dikwa.

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)

ACTIVE SERVICES
WASH services include construction of latrines and showers, distribution of sanitation materials, dislodgement of latrines/solid waste, chlorination of water, hygiene promotion and maintenance of WASH facilities.

GAPS
There are 28 damaged latrines in Bama (4), Pulka (19) and Ngala (5). Lack of lighting around the latrines in Bama, Gwoza, and Pulka poses a protection risk. In Monguno and Pulka, there is need of partner support to the adolescent girls and women with hygiene kits for proper personal hygiene. There's need for water reticulation system to reduce the suffering in Pulka.
