

North-West Syria - CCCM Cluster Displacement Report (October 2023)

CCCM Cluster and partners monitored and tracked movement of the IDPs in Northwest Syria following the military escalation from 4th - 9th October 2023, escalated and relentless attacks on communities in Northwest Syria.

Highlights

Over **68,100** individuals were displaced from greater Idleb and Aleppo to IDP sites, and communities in North Idleb while some families crossed to Aleppo Governorate. Most affected villages located along the frontlines; in Jabal al-Zawiya, Sarmin, Bennish, Ariha, Daret Azza, and Jisr al-Shughur were targeted by airstrikes.

Departures from Communities

Partners reports showed significant movement of the **68,100** displaced individuals from 91 communities. Notable departures include 18,000 individuals from Ariha sub-district, **14,250** from Daret Azza sub-district, and **8,000** from Sarmin sub-district.

IDP Arrivals

KIs reported **56,691** arrivals in **162** communities. These arrivals encompass **11,995** IND in Dana, 10,098 IND in Afrin, and 7,877 in Maaret Tamsrin , sub-districts.

Arrivals to IDP sites and Reception Centers

Out of the total 56,691 DPs arrivals 21,342 were to existing IDP sites and new reception centers in Idleb and Aleppo. **2,742** of the IDPs are sheltered in 12 previously established Reception Centers that were reopened, or extensions of existing centers initiated earlier in the year due to the earthquake. 5,130 of the IDPs were reported in Four newly established sites in Afrin.

Movements

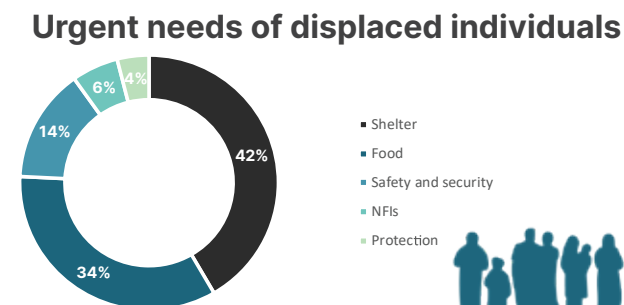
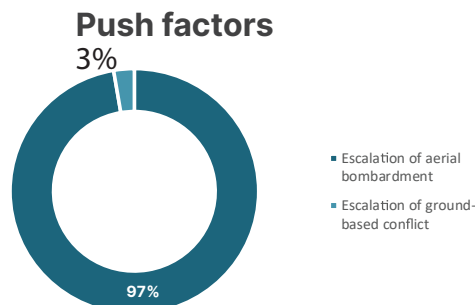
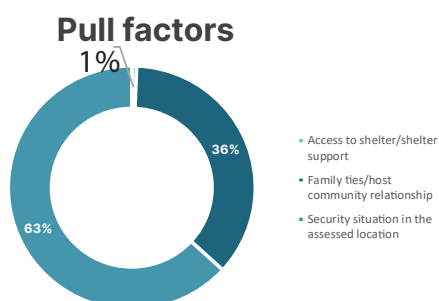
916 individuals are reported to have moved back to their homes in Idleb, Dana and Jisr-Ash-Shugur sub-districts. While majority IDPs plan to return home within a week if the situation improves.

CCCM Cluster response

CCCM partners provided assistance to 925 IDPs \ 160 families in 7 camps (Al Zohour, WATAN second typical camp2, WATAN first typical camp1, Burdaqly(AI Marj), Kelly (Al Rayhan), Al-Aika, Talmenes (Ard Aljameh)) and two reception centers. The partners continue to provide CCCM emergency services including registration, relocation and management of reception facilities.

Gaps and Challenges

The CCCM Cluster requires \$1 million to manage the established reception facilities and respond to the needs of new arrivals .



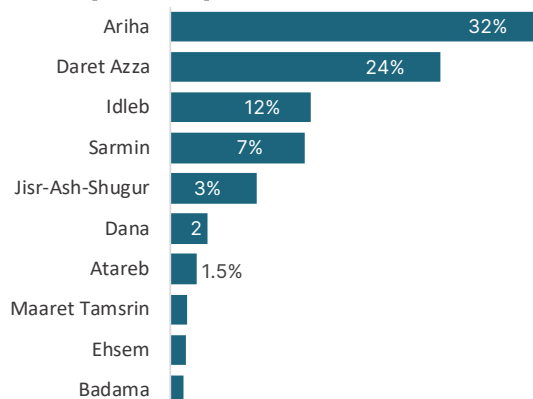

Top 10 departure sub-districts - out of 24

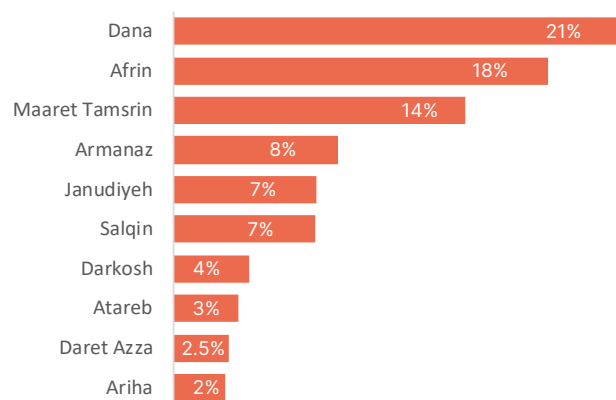
