



NIGERIA BAY STATES CAMP CONGESTION, SHELTER NEEDS, LAND REQUIREMENT AND ARRIVAL TRENDS 2019

OVERVIEW

In the 3 BAY states Borno, Adamawa and Yobe, there are over 71 areas considered to be highly congested (as per the sphere standards), with Borno having a total of 69 sites in 15 LGA's, while Adamawa and Yobe have 1 site each respectively. Similarly, there are 27 sites considered moderately congested in Borno state and 1 in Adamawa state. 18 sites in Borno state were considered lowly congested, 2 in Adamawa and 3 in Yobe state. While the remaining 151 sites tracked under DTM were considered uncongested, with 117 sites in Borno, 22 in Adamawa and 12 in Yobe. The size of land needed in the 3 states to ease the congestion in the 271 sites across the 3 states will be 1,491 Hectares in Borno 8 and 2 Hectares in Adamawa and Yobe respectively. This will construct 77,091 shelters in Borno, 1,174 in Adamawa and 923 in Yobe to cover the current Persons of Concern without shelters in this areas.

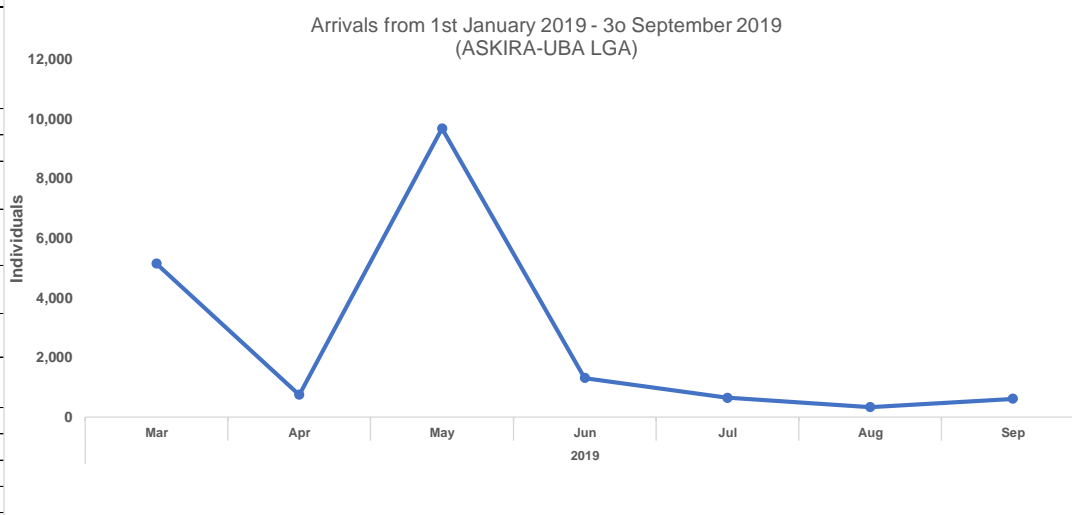

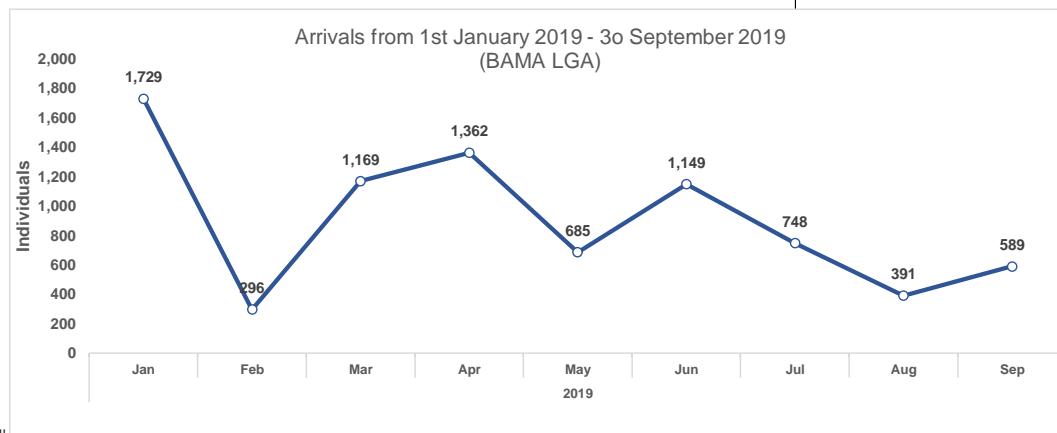
