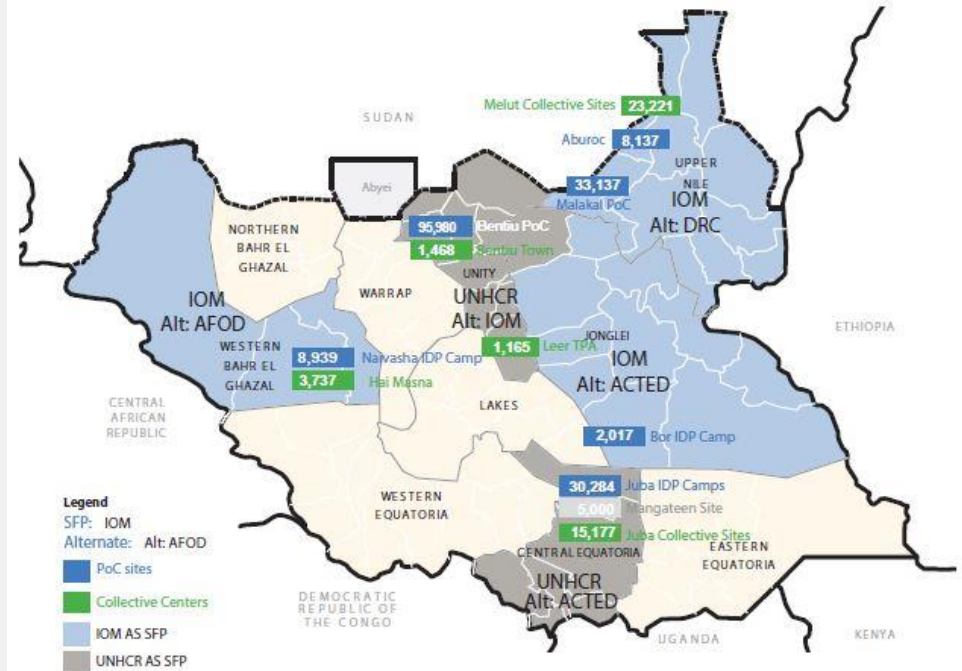


Overview of the CCCM Cluster

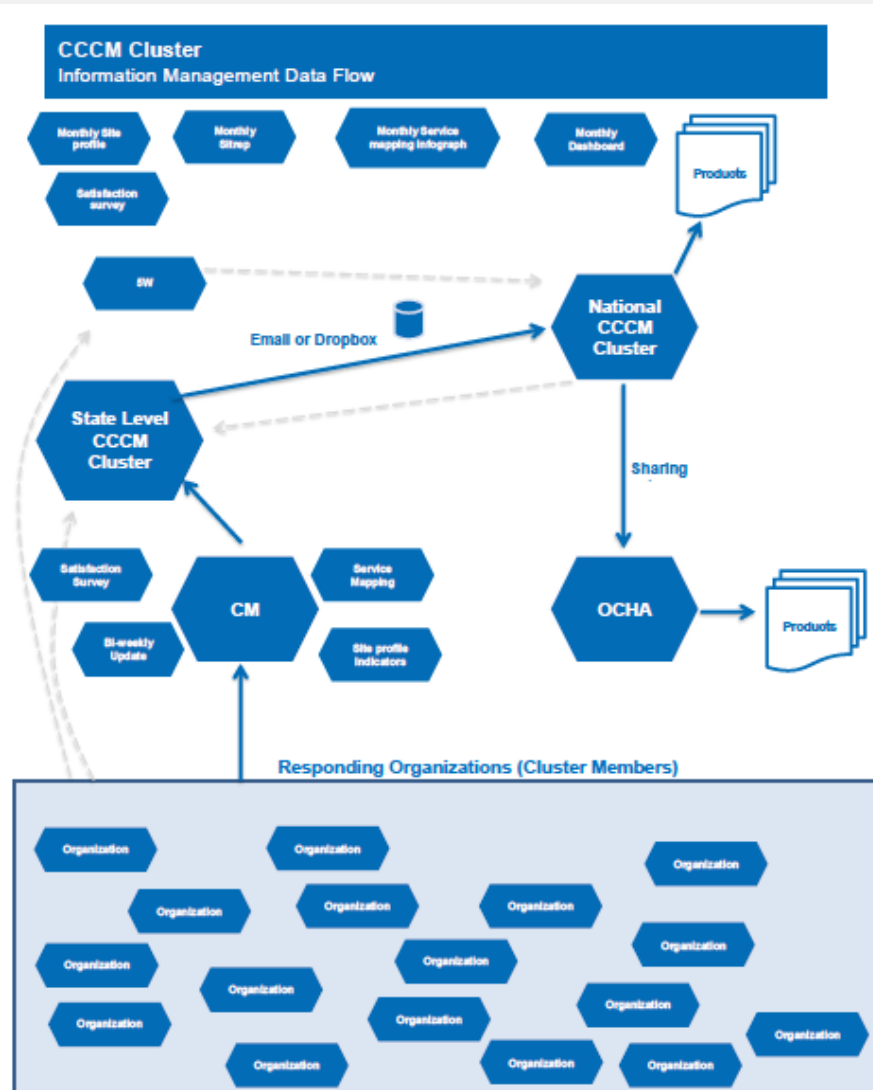

BACKGROUND
The Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) Shelter-Food Item (SFI) and Protection Cluster together with UNHCR, IOM, OCHA, HRC and MEDAIR conducted a rapid assessment of the shelter needs of IDPs in Don Bosco, Mahad and Mangaten Collective Sites. The visit was in the context to consider that humanitarian assistance should be designed in such a way that they respond to the critical needs of the affected population, while making optimal use of the available resources.

THE ASSESSMENT ESTABLISHED THAT IDPs IN ALL THE THREE COLLECTIVE SITES IN THE REVIEW AREA FACE COMMON CHALLENGES:

1. Crowded and dilapidated shelters (Don Bosco and Mahad) that do not accommodate increases in the population;
2. Poor ventilation for all the tents in Don Bosco and Mahad;
3. Compromised ground;
4. Poor household hygiene;
5. Subjects of communal use of unhygienic water, ventilation and hygiene (WASH) facilities.

FINDINGS

- Shelter tent distribution in Mahad and Donbosco was in 2015/2016.
- Widespread shelter and living conditions.
- UNHCR engaged IDP support.
- Don Bosco IDPs, open defecation areas hygiene concerns.
- Hygiene (clean, well organized) some household activities taking place.
- Mahad community request notice to vacate the site from the local administration.
- General shelter condition in Mahad and Don Bosco identified the regular maintenance and operational support.
- A visit to the market showed minimal economic activities going on as the market was empty.

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS

- Targeted Shelter assistance to IDPs in Don Bosco and Mahad.
- Intensive Hygiene promotion.
- Intensive Community engagement for case research focusing an necessary membership.
- Good access to market for Hygiene, Case research membership.
