Daily Labor Wage Rates for July 2024

The official BOSS exchange rate of 1 USD for the month of **July 2024** is **1593.1079 SSP**.

CCCM Cluster communicates the labor rate on the first day of every month, to ensure consistent application across all displacement sites. CCCM Cluster encourages all site management agencies and service providers to share this information to the community, to ensure transparency and accountability.

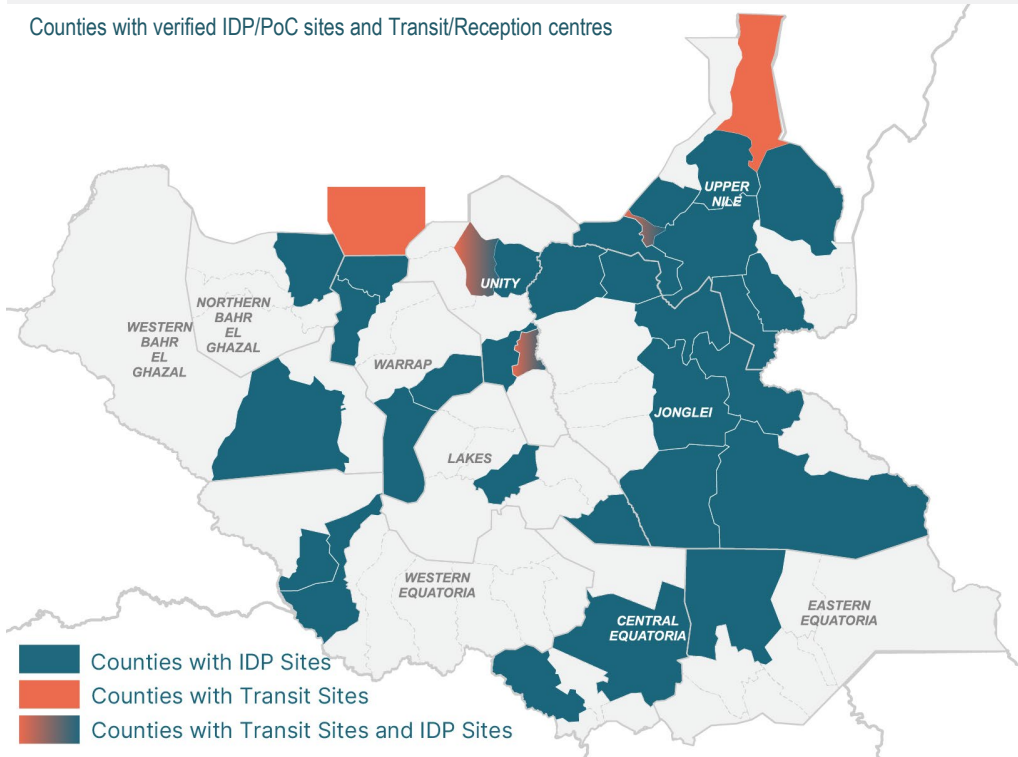
Below is the general list of types of work under each category, as recognized by cluster partners, and applicable across all site typologies.

E.g., Malakal PoC, Bentiu IDP site. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Manual laborers Construction & site maintenance casual/manual workers (including demarcation, drainage, fencing, dismantling, grass slashing, etc.) Cleaning (incl. WASH facilities) casual workers Guards Crowd management casual workers Warehouse (loading / offloading) casual workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Construction and site maintenance workers supervising unskilled casual workers Pump operators Handy men Road labeling team Burial team Casual workers for tasks that require ability to read/write and basic English language skills to communicate (e.g., enumerators, outreach workers) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Construction team leaders Technical workers (e.g., carpenters, masons, electricians, welders) Supervisors of semi-skilled casual workers Team-leaders of site maintenance projects Outreach team leaders / community mobilisers Library attendants Computer trainer Complaints and Feedback Desk worker
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Transit centers and Reception centers: established to receive new arrivals and accommodate a population for a limited amount of time while transiting to another location. E.g., Renk TC, Joda RC. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Self-settled IDP sites: areas where IDPs have settled spontaneously following displacement and are not integrated with the host community. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Collective centers: displaced populations sheltering in pre-existing mostly non-functional buildings which were not originally designed as accommodation.
