


CCCM Cluster | South Sudan Daily Labor Wage Rates for July 2024

The official BOSS exchange rate of 1 USD for the month of July 2024 is 1593.1079 SSP.

CCCM Cluster communicates the labor rate on the first day of every month, to ensure consistent application across all displacement sites. CCCM Cluster encourages all site management agencies and service providers to share this information to the community, to ensure transparency and accountability.
