Why CCPM



CCPM is a self-assessment exercise. Clusters monitor their performance against **(i)** the six core cluster functions set out in the Reference Module for Cluster Coordination at Country Level and **(ii)** accountability to affected populations.



Helps clusters fulfil their core cluster functions and become more efficient and effective coordination mechanisms.



Undertaken annually in protracted emergencies. In sudden onset emergencies, a CCPM process maybe undertaken within three to six months after the onset and once every year thereafter.



For case of Sudan – Survey rolled out in March 2024, 8 months after the Cluster activation.



Feedback received from only 10 core participating partners/representative.

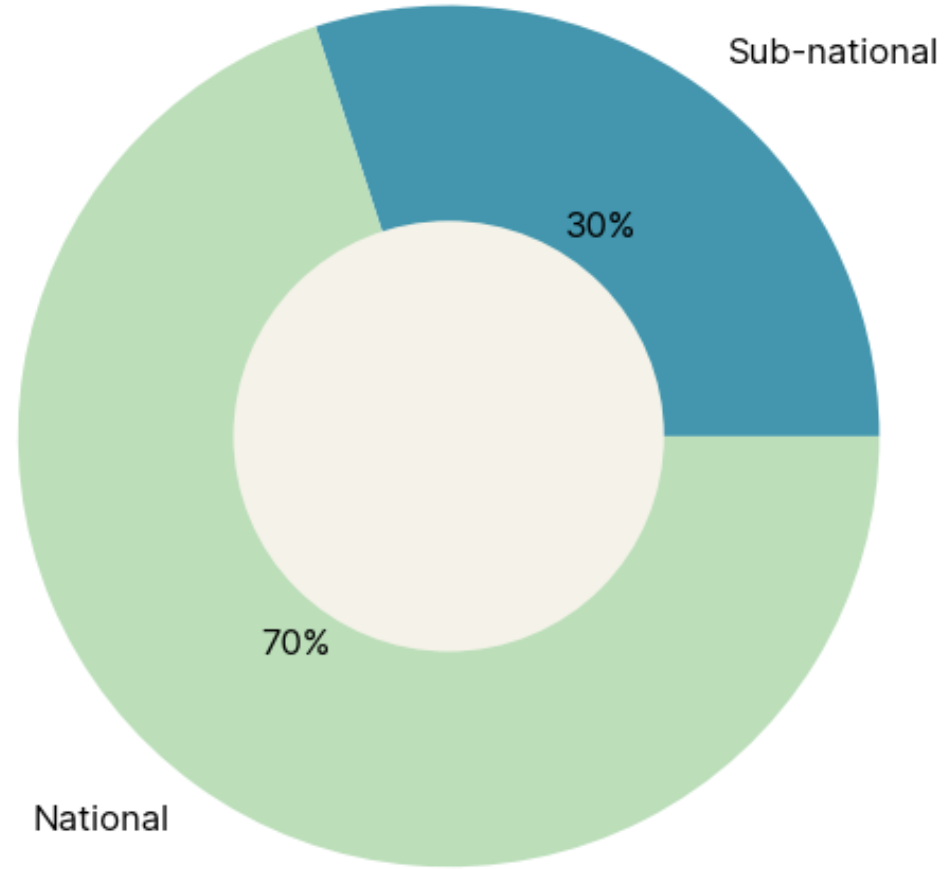

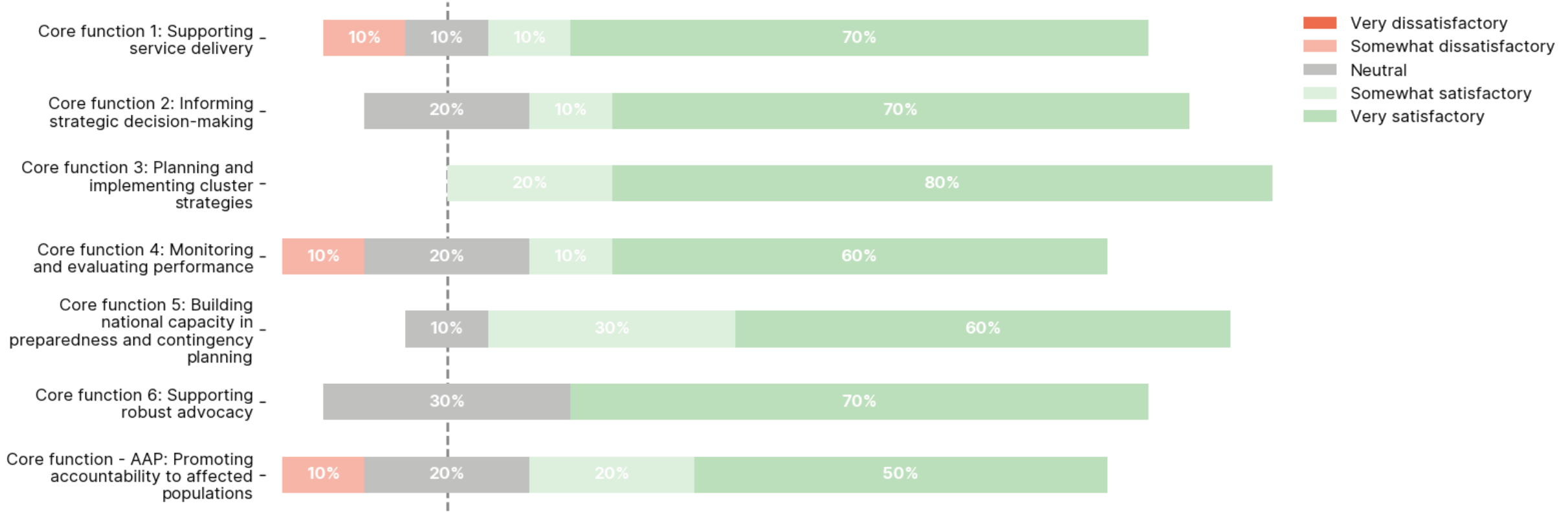

Respondents, by participation-level

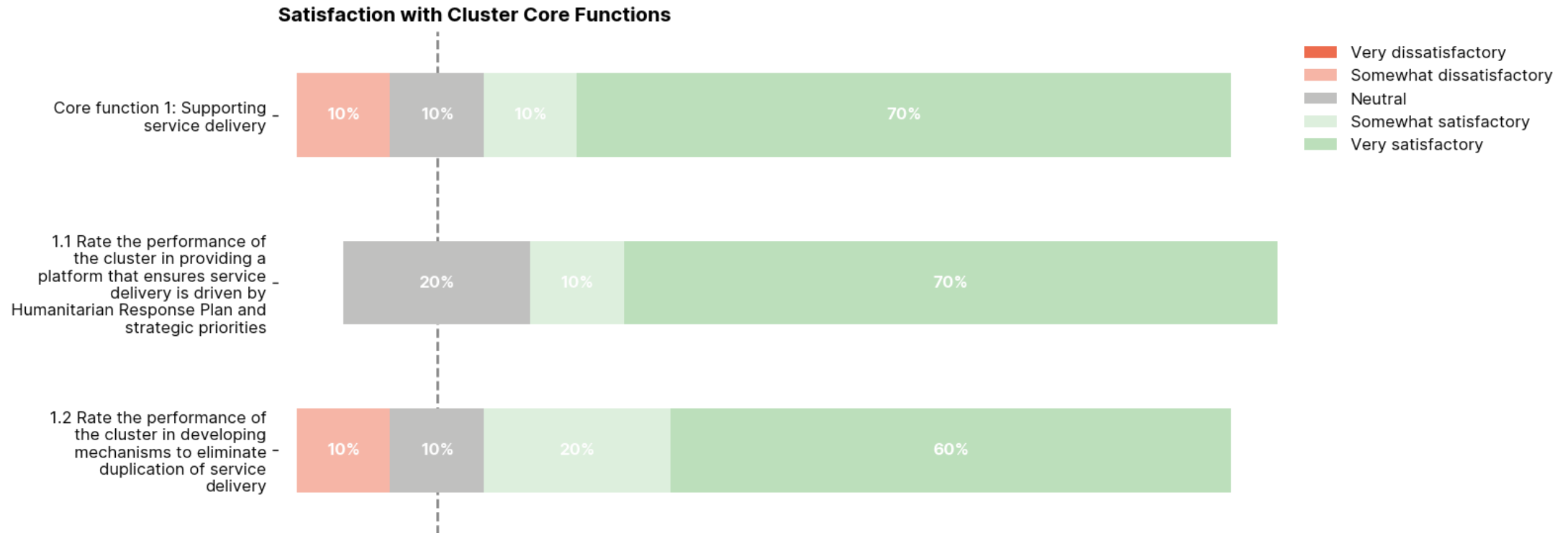


Satisfaction with Cluster Core Functions



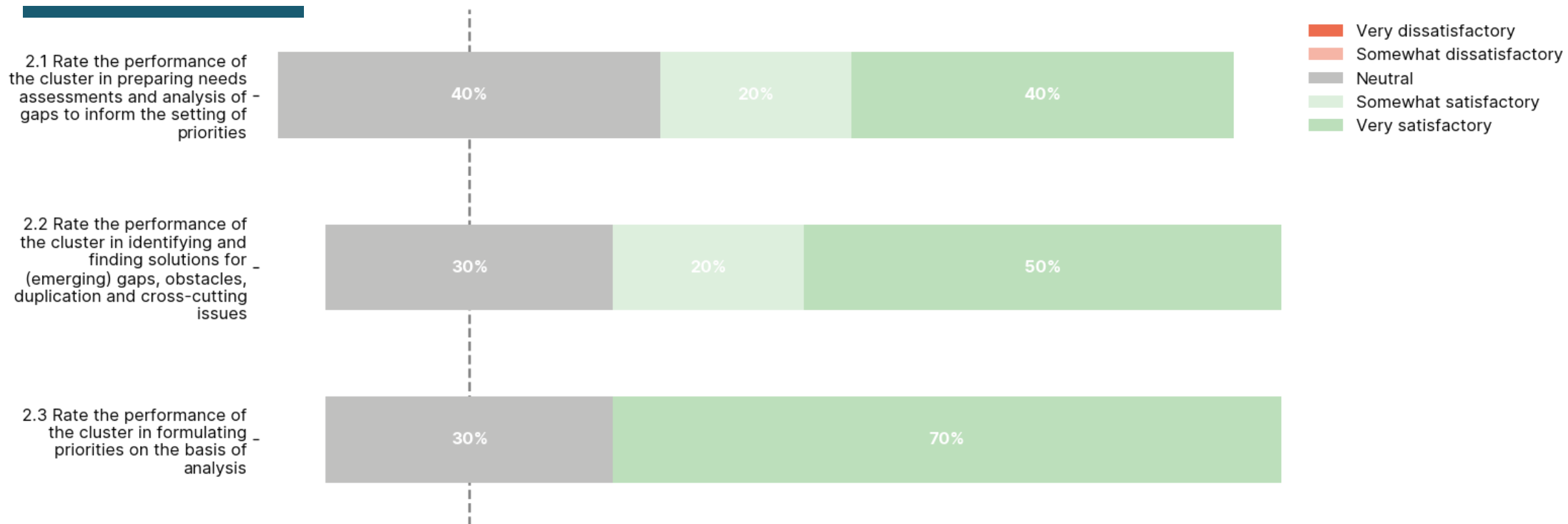

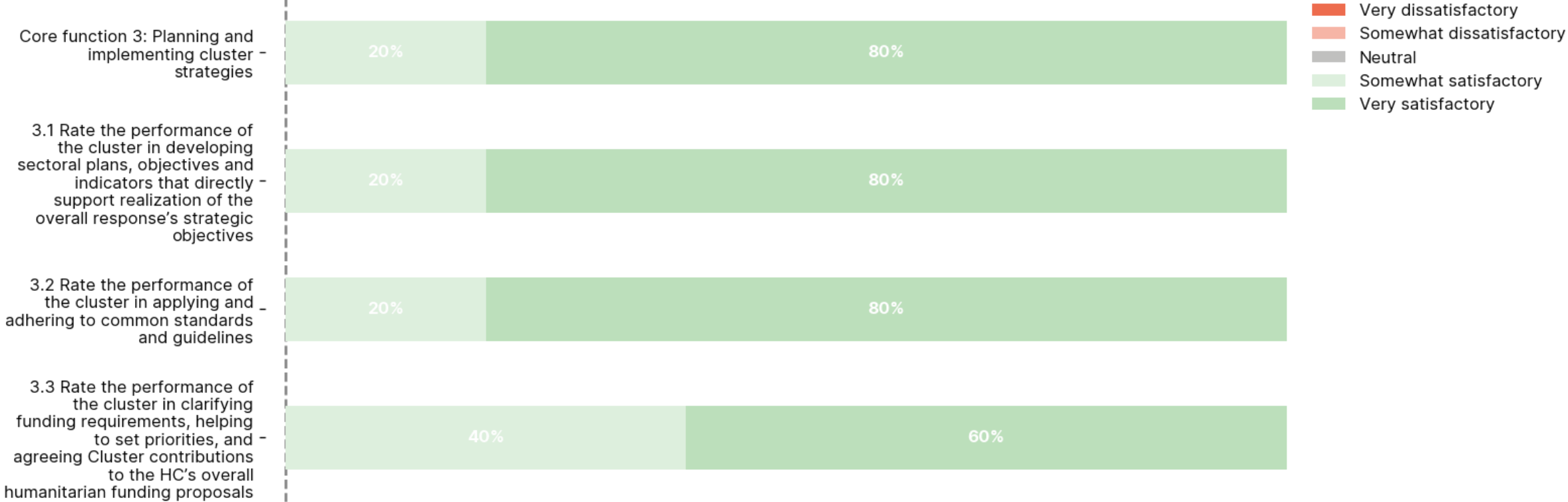

Satisfaction with Cluster Core Functions



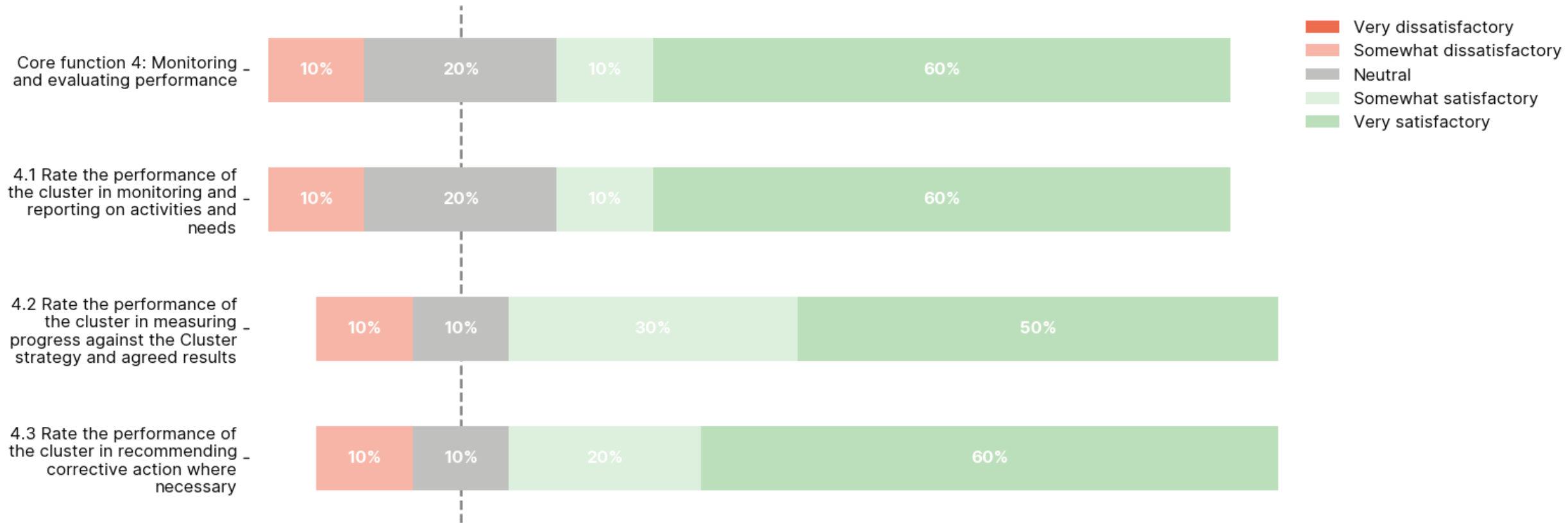
3. Planning and implementing cluster strategies

Satisfaction with Cluster Core Functions



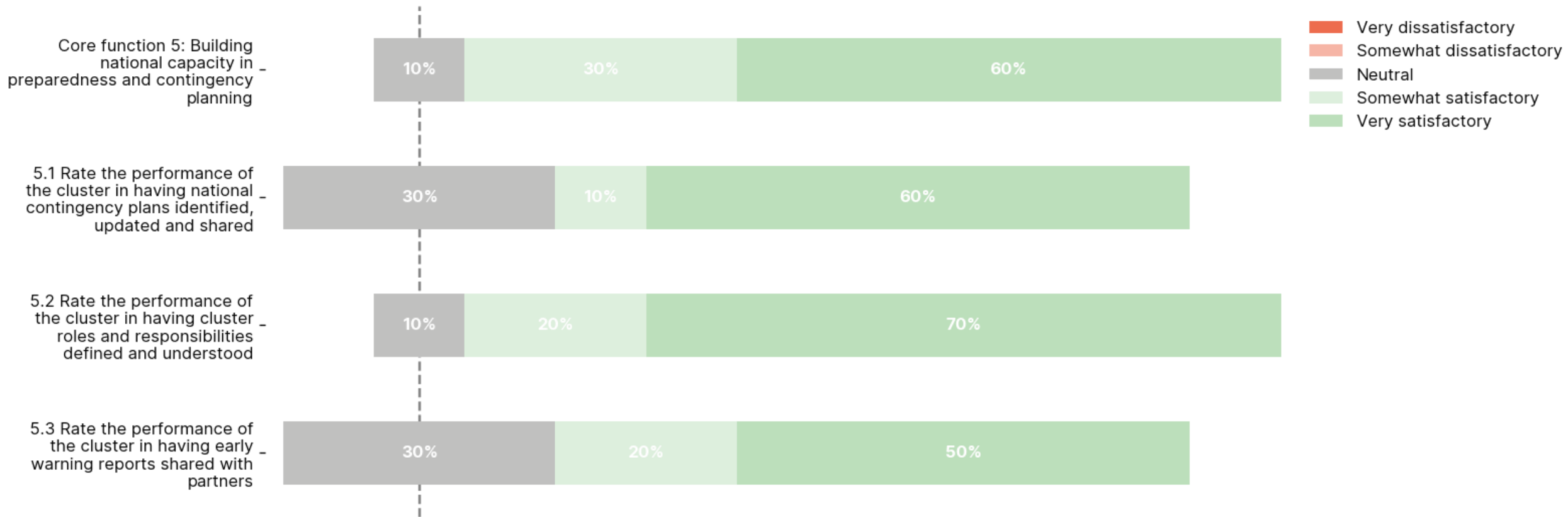
4. Monitoring and evaluating performance

Satisfaction with Cluster Core Functions



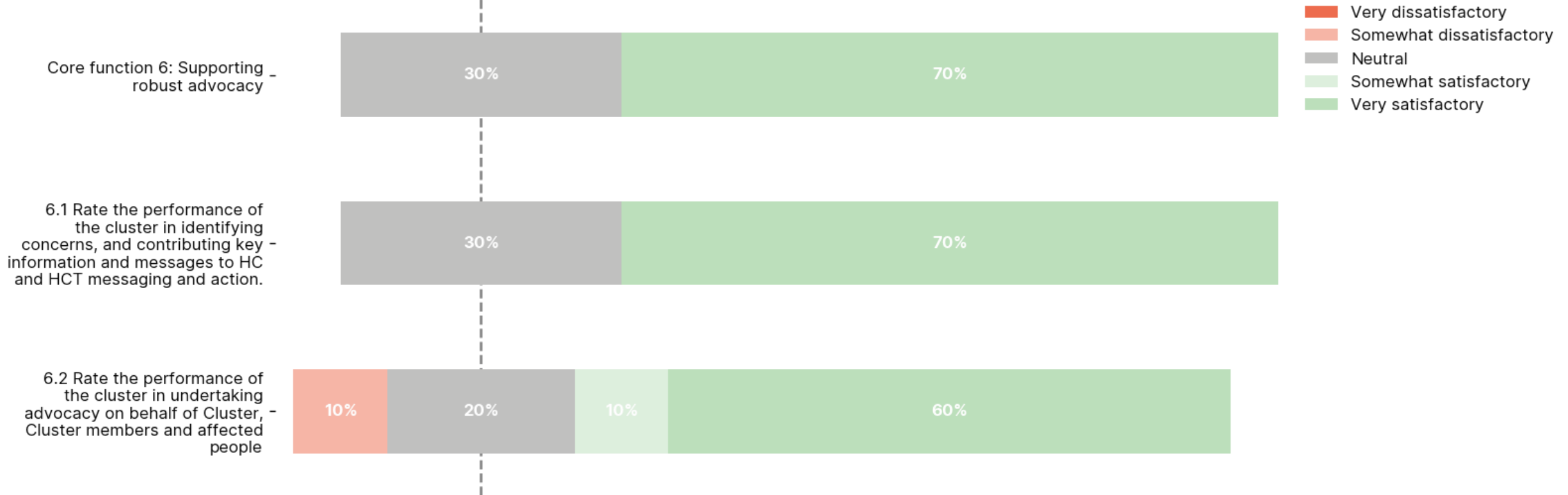

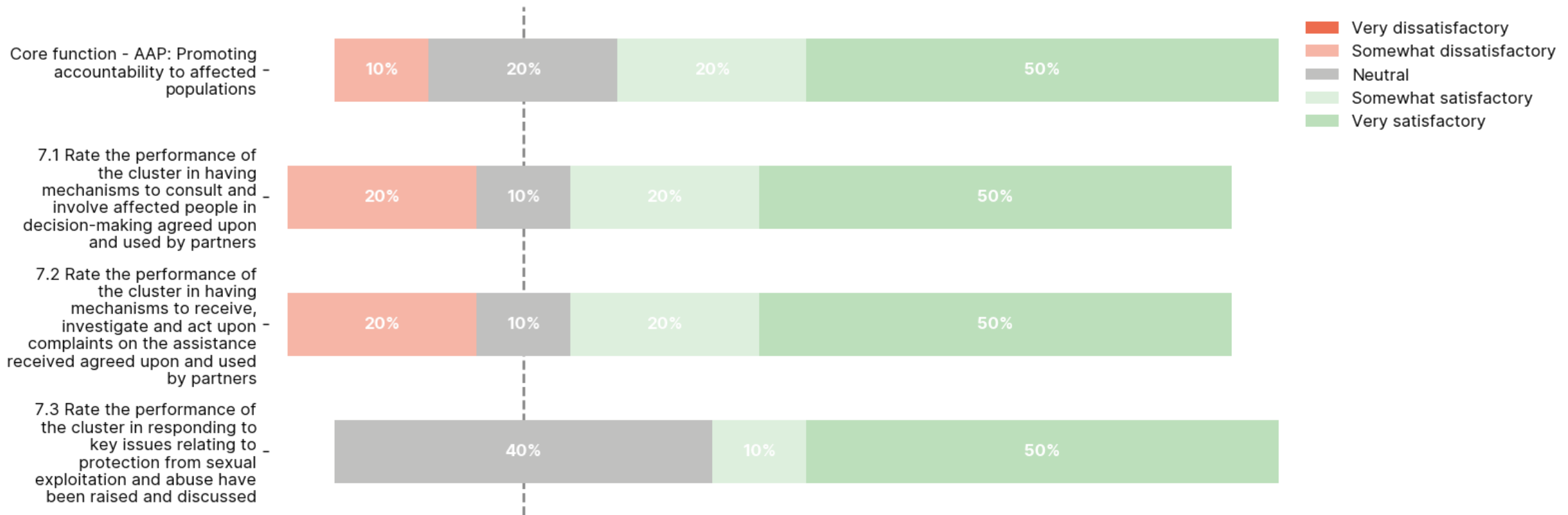

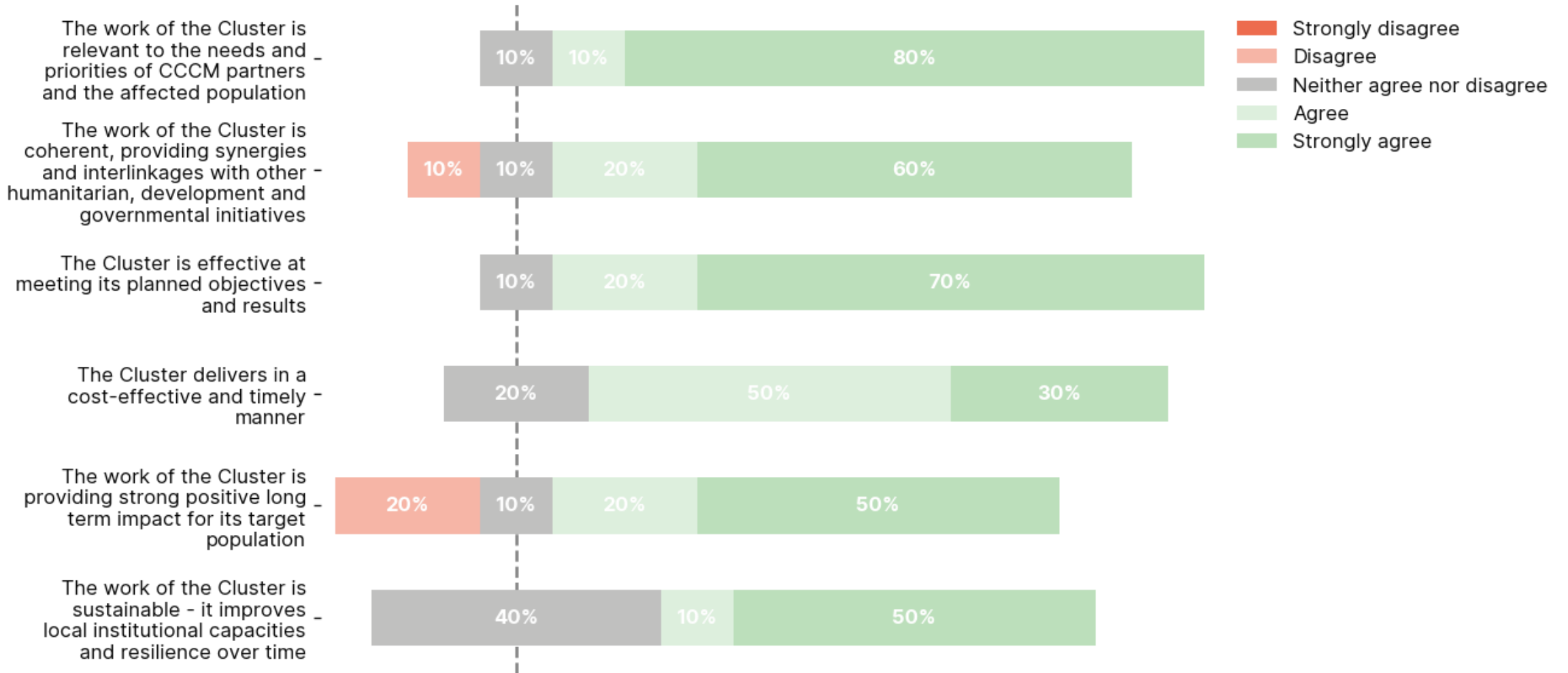

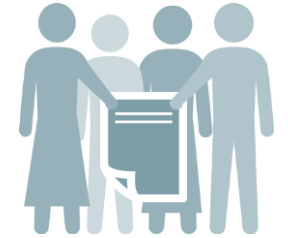
