## **SUMMARY POINTS**

- CCCM Cluster Update:
  - CCCM Cluster has encourage the NGOs/INGOs to take a moment to fill out the Funding Gap Analysis , which will be used to reflect the Cost of Inaction (CoI)
  - CCCM Cluster shed the light on Chief of Global CCCM Cluster mission to NWS.
  - Human Appeal updated CCCM Cluster members regarding the IDPs relocation to new established Al Yasmeen camp and the role of CCCM and Protection Clusters in selection criteria.
  - Watan Foundation has updated the Cluster members about their recent response to new arrivals through tent and CRI NFI distribution.
  - Muzun Foundation gave an update about displacement movement in NWS and incident reports.

## • Key updates from the cluster operational partners:

- In the September ISIMM update, 5 IDP sites were deactivated, and CCCM encouraged cluster members to report any changes related to the closure, evacuation, or merging of IDP sites.
- To prepare for potential displacement influxes, CCCM proposed two solutions: utilizing IDP sites with available expansion areas to accommodate newly arriving IDPs. According to CCCM data (ISIMM Plus), these expansion areas can host an additional 85,000 IDPs.
- ACU presented the findings from their winter assessment, which covered all IDP sites listed by CCCM.

## • IDP Site integrated Monitoring Matrix (ISIMM)

- 1,523 IDP sites are listed in the IDP Site Integrated Monitoring Matrix, that host 1,991,048 IDPs (373,220 families).
- 5 sites were inactivated in the September update. Number of sites reduced for different reasons such as camp closure, joining families, or unwillingness for relocation as they want to stay closer to the city centre due to livelihoods.
- o Cases of split sites have been observed and will be addressed with local authorities.

## • Incidents:

 In September, the CCCM Cluster reported a concerning increase in fire incidents across Idleb and Aleppo, with 35 incidents occurring in 31 IDP sites. Strong winds in Idleb further exacerbated the situation, causing significant damage and disruption. The incidents had a substantial impact, affecting approximately 525 households and destroying or damaging over 63 tents across 11 sub-districts, including Dana, Maaret Tamsrin, Azaz, Armanaz, Afrin, and others. Fortunately, no fatalities were reported. However, two injuries were documented iJandairis and Atma communities. • In response, CCCM Cluster partners including Watan, NRC, Ihsan RD, and Muzun, swiftly provided assistance to the affected individuals. The primary response included the distribution of tents and NFI.
