

First Six Months: Key Achievements

Partners have conducted **720 site assessments** in sites outlining demographics, multi-sectoral assistance, and priority needs for over 1 million displaced people.

- People on the move: SMWG partners have supported with data and referrals for people following evacuation orders.
- SMWG maintains a site master list providing partners across clusters with a comprehensive overview of 2,465 site locations throughout the Gaza strip. Partners have used this data for life-saving assistance delivery including the polio campaign, health facility gap-filing, and winterization support.



Community • mobilization & participation & two-way communication with site residents



- Partners ensure community participation in site-level decision making and leadership with support to diverse committees in 28 sites. This includes 107 individuals in committees.
- Neighborhood based approach: SMWG partners are piloting this site management strategy to ensure that displaced people in sites and their neighbors in four neighborhoods covering 171 sites work together to inform service delivery and prioritization.

Site improvements & maintenance



- To prepare for the winter, SMWG partners conducted **rapid flood assessments in 101 sites hosting 450,720 displaced people**. This includes 56,32 individuals (32,449 children) living in 73 sites on the coast in 6,813 makeshift shelters. In 97 sites, committees are in place and ready to start winterization preparedness.
- Partners are already supporting committees on winterization in **35 sites**.

Protection mainstreaming



• Partners have conducted community-led safety audits in 7 sites covering 104 individuals. With limited access to materials, goods, and services, partners will support communities in designing and implementing solutions to safety and protection concerns at site level.
