

SUMMARY POINTS

CCCM Update on the current escalation

- The CCCM Cluster is monitoring displacement caused by the recent escalation of conflict in northwest Syria.
- Updates will be shared with cluster members regarding the reception centers prepared to accommodate displaced IDPs.
- An Excel template will be circulated to collect information on the response to the recent displacement.
- The CCCM Cluster, in collaboration with REACH, has delivered a ToT training session on data collection.

Cluster Members Update

- **Human Appeal:** Activities in Idlib and western Aleppo, including mobile teams, have been suspended.
- **GOAL:** Activities in Idlib and western Aleppo have been halted.
- **Takaful:** Plans to receive 4,000 NFI kits in December.
- **Watan:** Has established a reception center in Kelly with eight rub halls.
- **Muzun:** Currently has 5,000 winter NFI kits supported by IOM.

SCHF + AFNS

- **SCHF Reserve Allocation:** Seven cluster members have submitted proposals with a combined budget of \$3 million, focusing on fire response and care & maintenance activities.
- **AFNS Third Allocation:** The CCCM Cluster has prioritized activities such as care & maintenance, site monitoring, fire response, and the establishment of camp committees.

PIN & Severity

The CCCM Cluster has finalized the People in Need (PIN) calculation, estimating 2.4 million people across the Whole of Syria, with 2.1 million in northwest Syria and 0.3 million in northeast Syria. There have been no significant changes in severity indicators compared to the previous year. In northwest Syria, 18 subdistricts are classified as severe, and 13 are classified as extreme.
